2. 28th January, 2023

Occasion: Say No To Election Violence Awareness (Plateau State Chapter)

Venue: Jebu Miango District, Bassa, Plateau State

Details: Details: The Strategic Action for Community Development (SACD), in collaboration with several Non-Governmental Organizations (NGO's) across Nigeria, initiated an awareness program targeted at enlightening members of several rural communities scattered across Nigeria on the importance of electoral participation, the need to shun electoral malpractices such as vote buying, rigging, etc, and to inform them of the importance of the upcoming election in order to improve the voter turn-out and ensure they understand that their votes count. 


Fig. 4.2. One of the participants at the Program




Fig 6.3 Volunteers distributing clothing items

10. Name of outreach: Pad Project Drive

Venue of outreach: The Ambassador College, Oju Ore, Ota, Ogun State.

Date of outreach: 5th April 2023.

Impact of outreach

Number of items distributed: 350 Diva pads were distributed to 175 girls, 100 Menstrual Trackers were distributed randomly, and 1 Pad Bank and 10 Body Sprays were given to those who answered questions as gifts.

Details of outreach: Most of the volunteers present got there by 2:45 noon, The Pad Project Drive was opened by Mr Segun who introduced the two foundations to the girls before he started the First Talk. During the Talk, He spoke about period stigma that is being experienced by Ladies in the society after which Miss Elizabeth of The Pad Project talked about approaching puberty and she took her time to explain to the girls the information needed by the girls in order to build their self-esteem and confidence in being a female.

Lastly, Miss Tolulope of Naza Agape Foundation then took over the stage and educated the girls about Period and Personal Hygiene. The cons and pros of having good hygiene. She also handled the questions and answers part of the program where students who answered her questions were presented with gifts.

The Pad Bank was presented to one of the teachers and the Head girl of the school and several pictures and videos were taken with the Teachers, Students, and the Volunteers. Certificates were also presented to the Volunteers and pictures were taken to capture the moment.



16. 16th April 2023

Occasion: Good Deeds Day

Venue: Clapai Orphanage home and Jos University Teaching Hospital

Details: To commemorate Good Deeds Day, The foundation split its volunteers into two groups and visited the Clapai orphanage home, and the Jos University Teaching Hospital(JUTH) simultaneously.

a. The first group of volunteers who visited the Clapai orphanage home were involved in the general environmental clean-up, i.e. they swept in and outside the house, washed the restrooms, did the dishes, etc. The volunteers also groomed the children, plaiting and barbing their hair.

During the visit, the volunteers observed that the orphanage home had some

challenges that could be harmful to everyone in the home. They include

- 1. Faulty drainage in the restrooms.
- 2. The restrooms had no doors.
- 3. Use of laundry soap for bathing.
- 4. Some of the children did not have shoes.
- 5. Insufficient amount of cutlery.
- 6. The drinking water needed to be cleaner, healthier, and treated. It should not be consumed.
- b. The second set of volunteers visited three wards in the pediatric department at the Jos University Teaching Hospital (JUTH), Jos, Plateau State. The volunteers engaged the kids in some playful activities and then shared gifts with them. They also prayed for the children and shared words of affirmation stickers, and toiletries. All 78 children were happy at the end of the visit.

18. 7th June, 2023

Occasion: School Tour

Venue: Secondary Schools

Details: The foundation, in collaboration with the **Women of Foresight** (a non-governmental organization), embarked on the "**SCHOOL TOUR**" campaign to four schools to have a discussion with the adolescents, explaining the effects of their actions and decisions, and encouraging them to stand for what is right and continue to live good lives, to educate adolescents on the topics that affect them and no one seems to care to discuss with them. We went to four schools in Plateau State, Nigeria.

The three ladies from the Women of Foresight were:

- Ms. Adanchin Lois (Women of Foresight)
- Ms. Keziah Danladi (Women of Foresight)
- Ms. Chiamaka Ikpekaogu (Women of Foresight; Speaker, Teenage pregnancy)

We visited four schools and three main issues were addressed: Drug abuse, teenage pregnancy, Puberty, and adolescence. Each school visited had three volunteers giving a talk on the topics stated. The schools visited were:

- 1. Success and Unity Secondary School, Jos.
- 2. Trinity Academy, Jos.
- 3. Full Assurance International Academy, Jos.
- 4. COCIN Secondary School, Rankyeng, Jos-South.

The best neatest and also the best-performing students were presented with gifts at the end of the visit.
